### We're 'Saving our Spire'

It was back in the Spring of 2017 that we became aware of the bad condition of the tower and spire of our Grade II listed church.

Since then the building has gone on the Historic England's 'Heritage at risk' register. As a listed building we are obligated to restore it at our own cost. Fortunately, we have been successful in being awarded a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant which will go about a third of the way towards the cost of the works (total approx. £600,000).

The good news is that as well as the renovation work we will end up with three new toilets – one of which will be fully accessible.

As a church we are not subject to ordinary local authority planning consents but instead the complicated church equivalent called the Faculty Process.

As part of this we are required to protect the bats which roost in the belfry and this work will be monitored by ecological experts in the field. We are reassured that they are not rare species but provision will still be made for them.

We're hoping that once the tower and spire are returned to their former glory we might attract back the Peregrine Falcon which paid us a visit a couple of years ago. Whilst the works are taking place it will be business as usual inside, we hope. It may not be quite such a photogenic setting for our brides and there will be some upheaval with the building itself. We will have two scaffolding towers inside the building to ground a cleverly cantilevered scaffolding design which will support the main scaffolding reaching into the sky over 170 feet above!

We appreciate that there will inevitably be a considerable amount of disruption for our nearest neighbours (which does, of course, include the Vicar!) and we apologise for this in advance.



# During the course of this year work will include:

- Masonry repairs and repointing of the tower and spire, removal of ferrous metal in the spire and overhaul of the cross and weather vane
- · Repairs to belfry windows, tower parapets and guttering
- · Overhaul and improvement of access to and within the belfry
- Installation of CCTV in the belfry to allow accessible viewing from the ground
- Restoration of the church bells.

# We will do everything we can to minimise disruption

We will be meeting regularly with the contractors who appreciate the quiet residential nature of our community and will do what they can to respect this and safeguard it during the works.

In order to take on this project we have gathered together a team of committed members of the church. Under the leadership of Team Rector, Rev'd Helen Hancock and with the Churchwardens responsible for the fabric of the building, the Team has experience in the law, banking, revenue and customs, marketing and communications.

The expertise on the building is provided by our professional team and particularly our architect Nick Bethune of award-winning conservation architects Oliver West & John Scott Architects Ltd.

The contractor appointed for the job, Universal Stone, is celebrating its 80th anniversary this year, so its credentials are longstanding. They have worked on historic buildings such as Leeds Castle, St Andrew Undershaft, St Mary Axe and Union Chapel Islington and will be using their tried and tested sub-contractors to support the programme of works.

The appointment of the Contractor followed a lengthy and careful vetting process and there will be a comprehensive safety plan in place which covers all aspects of working on site.

We are indebted to many individuals who have already donated towards our Appeal. We also acknowledge with gratitude the support of the H B Allen Trust, the National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Diocese of Southwark.


