'There is a time for everything

and a season for every activity under the sun' is part of a Bible reading from Ecclesiastes chapter 3 which seems increasingly popular at funerals. At its most basic it reminds us that there is a time to live and a time to die but also times for opposing opportunities throughout our life - for tearing down and building up, for embracing and refraining from embracing, for weeping and laughing, for speaking and for being silent. We live our lives within these contrasting times and need to navigate our own path of mental well-being through them.

As I write this I don't think I can quite come to terms with how quickly Christmas is approaching. Even the prospect of Advent is quite untimely . . . Surely it's way too early! Advent should be a time of anticipation but what happens when events seem to come so thick and fast that we barely have time to take things in in the present, let alone be awaiting them! Time's like that, isn't it. Ten minutes spent doing some not very pleasurable activity whether that's the gym, the laundry or the tax return as against an hour spent watching a favourite TV programme or talking to a friend . . . How times plays tricks on us.

This tension within our experience of time is captured in the two Greek words for time - 'chronos' and 'Kairos'. 'Chronos' relates more to the quantity of time - when we look at our watches and can't believe it is that time already or when we look at our calendars . . . and can't believe it is Christmas around the corner! Perhaps we might view this sort of time as time which carries us along in a flowing river - we are borne along by it, perhaps against our will. Chronos time can make us stressed and tense.

By contrast, kairos time is more about the quality of time. Kairos time is when we are so deeply engrossed in something or fully enjoying something that time seems almost to stand still. Kairos is likened to swimming in a quiet lake which refreshes us.

Put like that, our different experiences of time seem more explicable. It's the difference between a minute and a moment. So perhaps the question for us this Advent is not only how are we going to be spending our time but what sort of time it is!

The Psalmist gave us good advice in assessing how we might spend our time on earth when he wrote:

Teach us to number our days aright, That we might gain a heart of wisdom. Psalm 90.12

Such wisdom will be the wisdom of God which will lead us into holding a more balanced perspective in life. Reflecting the thinking in Ecclesiastes, our days, our time and the wisdom we gain through them will help us to meet whatever befalls us ... 'a time to mourn and a time to dance, ... a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them'.

If that's not enough to think about this Advent then there's always the fridge magnet which says 'How you spend your time is more important than how you spend your money.' That's an interesting aphorism to take with us into Advent, especially when both may be in short supply.

So now, there is just enough space left for me to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and blessings into the New Year, when the time is right. Like sending cards to Australia weeks in advance it all seems rather premature but we know that our Saviour will come once again to a stable far away and we shall come to worship, Amen.
