<u>Christmas Cards</u> We decided that for this year it is too complicated to bulk order and sell Christmas Cards in church. We will review how we do the communal one for KCAH in due course and hope to carry on with selling packs again next year.

<u>Annual Parochial Church Meeting</u> will be held on **Sunday 25 October** in the 10.30am service on Zoom – more details to follow.

The **Electoral Roll** will be revised starting on 30 Sept. If you would like to be added to it please find a form at the back of church or on the website and complete it and return it **by Saturday 10 Oct**. You can bring it to church on Sunday or post it through the Vicarage letter box. If in doubt please speak to Judith Jones our electoral roll officer or Helen.

We will also be looking to elect new <u>Deanery Synod Reps</u> and <u>new PCC members</u> along with two Churchwardens. Deanery Synod meets about three times across the year and is the first rung of the Church's decision making structure above our own PCC. Our church has three or four reps on Deanery Synod and this year we need to vote people in for a three year term of office. We are grateful to Philippa Alexander, Lesley Kennett and Jason Pennington who have been our reps for at least the last three years. Deanery Synod Reps are automatically members of the PCC too.

PCC members are elected for a three year term of office. They assist the Wardens and Helen in running the church and take responsibility on committees dealing with fabric, finance, discipleship, comms and others.

We will be also be appointing new **Churchwardens** for the coming year. With Pauline Keane having resigned after doing way more than her agreed term of office we are fortunate to have both Mike and Jackie willing to stand. But that doesn't stop anyone else who would like to as well.

If you might be interested in standing for any of these posts then, again, please speak with Helen or a Warden.

Giving – thank you to all those who continue to give to the church. Now people are returning to worship in church it would be wonderful to see our giving return to the amount closer to the pre-lockdown levels – it has reduced by 13% over the last six months . A collection will not be taken during the service but please do give in the collection bowls either at the entrance or the exit or better still start a direct debit to the church. Details for this are on the website. Cheques should be made payable to 'Surbiton St Matthew PCC.' The PCC this week agreed the level of contribution to the Diocese for next year and on current giving figures we will be running a deficit budget.

Hope in Depression- This is a free six week course for people living with, or caring for those with depression and anxiety. We will explore the possible causes, learn about brain chemistry and medication, hear about counselling and talking therapies and learn about ways to aid recovery and wellbeing. A different topic is covered each week by expert speakers including a psychiatrist, a counsellor, a mindfulness instructor, a nutritionist and a fitness expert. There will also be person al stories of recovery. During small group time we will discuss what has been shared at the front to help us reflect on the topic.
