THIS Team Walk - Summer 2021 . WE'RE BACK!!!!!

Hi all.

It's great to be able to say "We're back and walking."

This summer's THiS team walk and picnic will be on Saturday 7th August at 10.00 and will be based at Oaks Park, Carshalton.

Oaks Park has lots of parking, toilets and a café that serves hot and cold food.

Our walk will take us around a 2 mile nature trail through grassland, and lots of woodland offering shade from the sun, and we'll include an activity sheet for any children joining us. The walk has a couple of gentle upward slopes and is mainly broad paths with the occasional tree roots to step over – hiking boots are not required on this walk.

We anticipate having our picnic around 12:00 should you rather just join us for that.

If you'd prefer not to walk but simply join us for the picnic then the formal gardens or the café terrace would be a nice place to sit and relax

We'll also have a selection of outdoor games for people to play (if you've got some too please bring them along).

(Note that we won't spread the cornholes that wide)

Dogs are very welcome in Oaks Park. The walk does cross a road and run alongside another for a short way, so a lead is advisable at these points.

Directions to the Oaks Park car parks are as follows.

Make your way to the Banstead crossroads – A2022 and A217. From there take the A2022 towards Purley.

After 100 yards, at the mini roundabout, go straight on A2022.

At the next roundabout, take the second exit, A2022 Purley.

After 1.1 miles, as the road sweeps down, then up around to the right, look for the set of waist high kerb railings and at the end of the railings turn left into Oaks Park (a green sign shows the entrance).

Follow the road into Oaks Park and then choose either left or right turn to the parking. We'll meet by the café for the start.

As ever if the weather is rainy we'll call the walk off. We're looking forward to meeting up. Dave & Jackie Farris 07540702400
